This summer the globetrotting adventure continues at The Arts Center's exciting Arts & Culture Camp! Youth ages 6 – 12 will experience journeys to exotic parts of the globe with some of the West Coast's most respected artists and program leaders. Activities include: creating multi-medium artwork with paint, wood, paper, fabric, and clay; learning games and folktales from around the world; puppetry; basket weaving; designing a didgeridoo; adventures in Indian dance and music; cooking snacks from other lands; learning West African drumming and Spanish dancing. Students may also try their hand at circus arts such as juggling and clowning or creating unique sculptures for Da Vinci Days!

Join Mamadou Thioub from Senegal for West African Rhythms; local artist, Gale Everett for mud cloth printing; Anna Tewes for adventures in paper collage; and the Corvallis Environmental Center for an exploration of Africa's animals, ecology, and geography. Camp participants will celebrate the end of camp with a puppet show of Portland's esteemed Oregon Shadow Theater presenting an evening performance of Anansi the Spider Tales!

Sojourn to India June 23-27

Our journey through the subcontinent of India holds new, exciting Globetrotter adventures. The morning begins with yoga and kolam painting; join OSU professor, Michael Cullen for a class on "Acting Indian"; Eugene AIE artist Andrea Dipalma leads two exciting clay projects inspired by Indian folk tales and architecture; watercolor classes, and a film workshop led by artists at the Northwest Film Center! Students film projects for the week will be submitted to the DaVinci Day's Film Festival's Young Film makers 2009!

Adventure Australia June 30-July 3

Globetrotters go to the 'land down under' this week to explore Australia through creative art experiences. Ed Drury from Portland will lead a didgeridoo making and playing workshop; local artist, Suzanne Campbell will lead participants in creating their own bark journals and an exploration of aboriginal 'x-ray' paintings, conceptual artist Joey Azuel explores dream art; and poet Jennifer Richter leads

a workshop on sculpture and poetry inspired by the landscape of the Australian outback.

Circus Week: A World Celebration July 7-11

Come one, come all to the most exciting show on Earth! Our brand new circus week is full of surprises! Globetrotters put on your clowning shoes, International performer, Moshe Cohen (aka Mr. Yoowho) will teach vaudevillian style clowning and juggling; Sarah Lione Foster of Portland's Nomadic Theater will be teaching Creative Acrobatics and stilting; Eugene artist, Keri Jones will lead a workshop on the new art of hooping; local musicians Max Remus and Conner O'Shea-Williams teach young hopefuls ukulele; and Philomath artist, Rachel Kirby leads a mask building workshop. The week ends with a community circus showcasing the kids' new skills as well as a free performance by Mr. Yoowho!

Mediterranean Caravan July 14-18

Globetrotters grab your backpacks as we travel through one of the world's most diverse regions! This week participants 'sail' the Mediterranean as they explore boat building with artist Carol Selberg; explore the Italian Theatrical tradition of Commedia dell Arte; discover the clay traditions of Ancient Greece; Build interactive sculpture for DaVinci days, and cook up some delicious Mediterranean food with the First Alternative Food Coop's Chef in the Classroom program.

The Pacific Northwest Native Experience July 21-25

Participants of this week's emersion will discover the rich traditions in our own backyards! Joyce Greiner will lead a native experience class focusing on Native American arts and foods, the Oregon Historical Society's traveling trunk program offers hands-on learning experiences, and Rachel Kirby leads basket weaving; participants explore drum making, native naming poems, totem pole building, and more!
